The conference will be held at "Sergiu T. Chiriacescu" University Aula, in Braşov. Braşov (in German: Kronstadt, in Hungarian: Brasso) is the capital and largest city of Braşov county, Transylvania, Romania. It has a population of 283.901 inhabitants.

Certificate for the first time in 1234 in the so-called "Catalogus Ninivensis" lies between the big passes of the Carpathians (Bran, Predeal, Oituz, Buzău).

Being surrounded by lofty peaks of Postavaru, Bucegi,

Piatra Mare, Mount Tampa and one of the most coveted resorts in Romania - Poiana Brasov, was a perfect place to build a fortress. Thus, the old city founded by the



Teutonic Knights in 1211 is one of the few cities in the Middle Ages which were preserved so well in the mists of time. The city's geographical position made Braşov to be the center of the gathered riches weather, they meet people and ideas intersect. Powerful guilds (tailors, coppersmiths, blacksmiths, gunsmiths, drapers, weavers and goldsmiths) Braşov transformed into a powerful manufacturing center.

Today, Braşov is one of the main centers of economic, cultural and sports of the country, being also a major tourist center and a city of historical monuments like Black Church, the Bastions of the City, the Statue of Honterus, Town Hall, School Andrei Şaguna, Scheii Braşov, Church of St. Nicholas, the First Romanian School, Black and White Touwers, and near Brasov is Dracula Castle, Bran, and Peles Castle in Sinaia.
